

August 2021 Sermons at a Glance

August 1 – The 7th Principle

Have you felt overwhelmed with the climate change disasters and seeing tons of trash all over the planet? Our 7th Principle gives us the mandate to have: *Respect for the interdependent web of all existence of which we are a part.* We are a part of a beautiful web, and we have the power to do something about the problems we are seeing.

"We are the first generation to feel the effect of climate change and the last generation who can do something about it." —President Obama

On August 1st, Janine Deckard will show us how she has taken steps to do her part in her own life to adopt more sustainable practices on her farm. From how she washes her clothes to how she feeds her family, she will show us visually how she does it. You will come away from this service inspired and motivated to try new things to live the 7th Principle every day.

August 8 – The 8th Principle

The 8th day of the 8th month is the perfect time to contemplate the 8th Principle of Unitarian Universalism

"We the member congregations of the of the Unitarian Universalist Association, covenant to affirm and promote: journeying toward spiritual wholeness by working to build a diverse multicultural Beloved Community by our actions that accountably dismantle racism and other oppressions in ourselves and our institutions."

UUCOM voted to adopt this principle at our congregational meeting in May this year. Now what? The path forward must involve an examination of our past which has led to the institutionalized racism that is baked into our culture today. Thoughts and reflections for our service will come from excellent sources like the Netflix documentary *13TH* and Radiotopia's podcast series "The Vanishing of Harry Pace."

August 15 - "Come, Come Whoever You Are"

This spring Midland found itself the recipient of unaccompanied minors from Central America. Many people in our community were upset about the potential "danger" from these boys. Our community responded by asking what can we do to help these boys. Most of our families at one time were immigrants, too. Barbara Handley will lead this service as we remember our roots as immigrants.

August 29 - An Exploration of Faith: Part One, Leaving Church

At a time when I needed it most, I stumbled upon the writings of Barbara Brown Taylor and I saw in her books some of my own religious journey. My four-part series of sermons, based on Taylor's four most recent books, will introduce you to the compelling narrative of her journey from Episcopal priest to college religion professor. What Taylor learned in her own personal search for truth and meaning has so much relevance to us as UUs. And, if you in turn will commit to sharing a service with us, one of her books will become yours.


Phase 3 - Maximum Outdoor Space Opening

- Limited access/use. (including individuals: Church Staff, Board Chair, Treasurer, & Buildings & Grounds Chair, On the Couch Counseling Staff & Cleaning Service staff)
- Use Building Use Log –keeping a record of the time each person is in the church for contact tracing purposes.
- All those that enter the building have a mask on hand. Masks must be worn and social distancing put into effect when more than one person is in the building.
- We share the outdoor space with our tenants such as the Buddhist Group, Patty George's Yoga, & Tree of Life.
- Outdoor space at the church may be used for small groups (10 or less) by church members and friends. (Preferably less than 5)
- Each group must have a designated facilitator that requests usage of the space and keeps a log of those gathering for contact tracing purposes.
- The facilitator may access the space by the east iron gates near Midkiff, the facilitator can let people in through the wooden gate on the west side near the parking lot.
- The building will remain closed. If bathrooms are needed, the facilitator is to recommend the usage of a bathroom at a nearby business.
- Clean surfaces of common areas after use with disinfectant-outdoor furniture.
- We recommend that disinfectant supplies be ordered by the office and there be a cleaning station in each bathroom and by the log book/front entry.
- Available Space: Zoom1, Zoom2, Meditation Courtyard (memorial garden), Southside Courtyard
