

The congregation came to the board with concerns about the mask policy and the board voted to make a change on 5/17/2022. Masks are now a mandatory item but we are allowing congregational singing WITH masks.

This will allow our members with compromised immune systems and concerns about viruses; the peace to know they can worship safely.

We light this chalice to celebrate Unitarian (cup left hand to make a U) Universalism (cup right hand to make a U).


We are the church of the open minds (fingertips touch the forehead and swing open like a door).

GET TRAINED TO TEACH OWL! In light of the recent <u>Supreme Court ruling</u> against Roe v. Wade, the <u>Texas UU Justice Ministry</u> especially wants to encourage congregations to host more OWL classes. TXUUJM and First UU Church of Austin are hosting an OWL facilitator training Sept. 16-18 in Austin (levels 7-9/10-12). Please <u>see registration link here</u>. Scholarships available. Our friends at <u>NTUUC</u> is also hosting all-levels training in Dallas in August.

More about OWL from TXUUJM and First UU Austin: "We view this training as part of our larger work for LGBTQIA+ rights, gender justice, and collective liberation, especially at a time when some Texas politicians prey on trans-inclusive families for political gain and when books and programs for human sexuality are censored.
