#### **Church In-Person Service Reopening**

On Sunday, October 24, 2021 we will partially reopen the building for Sunday services. The board and the COVID Team gave much thought to the rules which we must all abide by as a way to properly care for each other and reduce the possibility of spreading the virus. Please read them carefully and be prepared to follow them.

We will also continue to broadcast our services over Zoom. We expect that Zoom will become a permanent part of our services so that people who cannot attend in person will be able to join us online.

#### THE RULES

- 1. Masks that cover the mouth and nose will be required for all participants (age 2 years and up). The exception to this will be speakers at the pulpit who stand behind the shield and individuals with medical issues that prevent mask usage.
- 2. All attendees must maintain 6 foot social distance. Exceptions only will be made for family groups.
- 3. Attendance will be taken for contact-tracing purposes.
- 4. Temperatures will be taken. All participants must register at 100 degrees Fahrenheit or below to be allowed entry.
- 5. Please use only the marked doors for entry and exit from the building.
- 6. Socializing areas will take place in outdoor spaces only (either under the front tree or in the south garden which will be accessible through the west gate only). The fellowship hall will not be open for socializing.
- 7. Though the sanctuary will be open, its capacity will be limited to 30 people. Should there be an overflow, we may use the fellowship hall for a small number of people. The only other areas open to all will be the bathrooms. The classrooms, kitchen, storage closets, library and offices will only be accessible to specifically authorized individuals.
- 8. There will be no congregational singing.

Just like the rest of you, the Board is looking forward to the day when we can return to what was our normal building use before the pandemic. We sincerely hope that day will be very soon. We will keep you informed. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact any board member.

### Worship Committee

### **UUCOM Members and Friends Survey**

It is the time of year to update our Members and Friends Directory for 2022. This year we are combining our directory update with the collection of additional demographic data to limit the amount of work for the congregation.

A more robust demographic collection process had been discussed by the Board for both internal UUCOM use and for the Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA), as they request demographic data from congregations as part of their annual UUA certification. To streamline this process in the future we are gathering this information alongside the UUMidland Congregational Directory update.

To facilitate this effort, a voluntary survey has been created to collect the demographic data and directory update. All demographic responses you provide will remain confidential. Your data will not be reported beyond the aggregate (combined data from all responses) congregational data without permission.

You will also be asked to update a directory listing for the 2022 Members and Friends Directory if applicable. Lastly a new online Directory request page is available (<u>https://bit.ly/3nAT2m0</u>) if you would like

#### Side With Love

We're saying 'No' to limits on reproductive rights. Read More.

As Unitarian Universalists, we embrace the reproductive justice framework, which espouses the human right to have children, not to have children, to parent the children one has in healthy environments, and to safeguard bodily autonomy and to express one's sexuality freely. Rooted in these values, we unequivocally declare that SB 8, and any law that attempts to criminalize reproductive freedom—including abortion care—is morally wrong.

And, in addition to our thoughts and prayers, our faith calls us to actively and courageously resist such injustice. Here are some ways you and your congregation can take action today:

- Read this update from Side with Love.
- Donate to support Texans seeking abortions. Give directly to organizations providing direct support and fighting against laws that violate our reproductive rights, such as <u>Sistersong</u>, the collective of <u>Texas abortion funds</u>, <u>Buckle Bunnies</u>, or <u>SACReD - Spiritual Alliance of Communities for</u> <u>Reproductive Dignity</u>.
- Join people of faith around the country to learn and strategize. Sign up to attend the <u>SACReD</u> <u>Gathering: Faith Communities Reclaiming Reproductive Dignity and Autonomy</u>, January 25-26, 2022. This event will be a first-of-its-kind virtual gathering of justice-oriented people of faith, activists, and leaders from the reproductive health, rights, and justice community. "Grounded in our shared values of justice, dignity, human rights, compassion, and expansive love, we will discover how faith and reproductive liberation are interdependent through keynotes, panel discussions, and breakout sessions."
