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February 2024 Sermons at a Glance

February 4 "The Man, The Dream, The Movement"





It is important is to take time to be quiet, to be still,

so we can be in touch with the deepest and best part of ourselves—our inner voice—often called prayer or meditation.

I invite you to join in a body prayer.

We begin with our hands in front of us in the prayer pose: "I am still"

We place our hands over our hearts: "I am loved."

We place our hands cupped in front of us: "I can receive."

We extend our hands out in front of us: "I can give."

We lift our hands high over our heads: "I am open to the Spirit of Life."

We bring our hands cupped in front of us again: "I receive these gifts." And returning to our stillness,

we bring our hands together again in the prayer pose: "I am still."

[repeat three times and end with a slow bow as a closing.]

UUA Newsletter


In November, the Article II Study Commission released its Final Proposed Revision to Article II of UUA Bylaws for review and discussion. Since then, UUs have shared feedback and developed proposals for amendments to the final language.

If your congregation plans to propose an amendment to the Final Proposed Revision of Article II, it must be submitted by 11:59pm ET on February 1, 2024. In the links below, you'll find details on the Final Proposed Revision and how to submit a proposed amendment, which must be endorsed by at least 15 certified congregations.

We are deeply grateful to the dedicated volunteers on the UUA Board of Trustees and the Article II Study Commission for their faithful and inclusive work on behalf of Unitarian Universalism. As Board Co-Moderator the Rev. <u>Meg Riley reminds us in *UU World*</u>, "Thousands of people were involved in creating this draft... [I]t's been a very inclusive process and the electronic process [for amendments] has made it even more inclusive."

Our work together on Article II will culminate at General Assembly in June 2024, where delegates will cast votes on amendments and whether to adopt this new language for Article II of the UUA Bylaws. Links and information about GA are also available in the information below.
