July 2021 Sermons at a Glance

July 4

On July 4, we consider our national shortcomings as well as our triumphs. Abigail Adams, the 2nd first lady of the United States, was a feminist, an abolitionist, and a Unitarian. She is a founding mother for social justice activism in the US, and can reshape how we think about our national history. She is part of a great American lineage of justice seekers, a genealogy that present-day activists, including Unitarians, strive to be a part of.

July 11

This Sunday's service will focus on the Fourth UUA Principle: the free and responsible search for truth and meaning. It is also known as the Green Promise: grow by exploring. Harry Nutter will explain why it is this principle that led to his following a spiritual path within Unitarian Universalism.

July 18 The 5th Principle: through the lens of South Korea.

Kurt Esslinger, a Presbyterian Church USA mission co-worker assigned to Korea will share what he has learned about Koreans Christians who put their faith into action in resisting South Korean military dictatorship and fighting for a true democratization and democratic participation in South Korea decades after the Korean War.

July 25

This Sunday Maureena Benavides will lead the service as we explore our Sixth Principle-- the goal of world community with peace, liberty and justice for all—through music.

Worship Committee

At our Spring Congregational meeting, our congregation voted for us to proceed as Lay-Led +. That means that most Sundays friends and members of our congregation will be leading the service. Once a month or so, we will have a guest minister/speaker (that is the plus). This means that we need UU to volunteer to help. There are many ways of assisting! You may be a Zoom Host, or Greeter! You may be an in-person Greeter when we open for hybrid services. You may be a Worship Associate. You may present a worship service. (The Worship Committee is here to help you!!!) You may share a gift of music by performing or by sharing musical suggestions. You may share suggestions for readings or service topics. There are many ways to share in our ministry. Church Reopening

Because the average number of positive Covid tests in Midland County has dropped to 5% or below for two weeks, the church Board voted to move the church to Phase 4.

In Phase 4, we will partially reopen the building. The board and the Covid Team gave much thought to the rules which we must all abide by in this phase as a way to properly care for each other and reduce the possibility of spreading the virus. Please read them carefully and be prepared to follow them.

Continuing this Sunday, we will welcome everyone back to the sanctuary for our 11 AM service.

We will also continue to broadcast our services over Zoom. We expect that Zoom will become a permanent part of our services so that people who cannot attend in person will be able to join us online.

The Rules

- 1. Masks that cover the mouth and nose will be required for all participants (age 2 years and up). The exception to this will be speakers at the pulpit who stand behind the shield and individuals with medical issues that prevent mask usage.
- 2. All attendees must maintain 6 foot social distance. Exceptions only will be made for family groups.
- 3. Attendance will be taken for contact-tracing purposes.
- 4. Temperatures will be taken. All participants must register at 100 degrees Fahrenheit or below to be allowed entry.
- 5. Please use only the marked doors for entry and exit from the building.
- Socializing areas will take place in outdoor spaces only (either under the front tree or in the south garden which will be accessible through the west gate only). The fellowship hall will not be open for socializing.
- 7. Though the sanctuary will be open, its capacity will be limited to 30 people. Should there be an overflow, we may use the fellowship hall for a small number of people. The only other areas open to all will be the bathrooms. The classrooms, kitchen, storage closets, library and offices will only be accessible to specifically authorized individuals.
- 8. There will be no congregational singing.

Just like the rest of you, the Board is looking forward to the day when we can return to what was our normal building use before the pandemic. We sincerely hope that day will be very soon. We will keep you informed.
