July 2022 Sermons at a Glance

July 3

On July 3, we consider our national shortcomings as well as our triumphs. Abigail Adams, the 2nd first lady of the United States, was a feminist, an abolitionist, and a Unitarian. She is a founding mother for social justice activism in the US, and can reshape how we think about our national history. She is part of a great American lineage of justice seekers, a genealogy that present-day activists, including Unitarians, strive to be a part of.

July 10

Come help us celebrate the bounty of our Earth and the people who bring that bounty to us as we start a new tradition: Produce Communion. In the spirit of Flower Communion, bring your favorite fruit or vegetable to share. If you want to honor our agricultural heritage, visit one of our local Farmers Markets to purchase local produce and thank the farmer for their hard work. In a series of readings, music, and prayer, we will reflect on how the food that nourishes us also connects us to the Earth.

July 17 Love is More

This year's Basin Pride Festival is July 16, and the Interfaith Pride Service will be at UUCOM at 1:00 on July 17. Before that, our 11:00 service will help us think beyond the popular "love is love" saying. Playwright and novelist Claire Willett recently said, "For Pride Month this year, can straight people focus less on 'love is love' and more on 'queer and trans people are in danger?'" Rev. Dr. Steven Gaines will respond to that invitation in consideration of UU Principles.

July 24

In this fantastical (and very interactive!) story, we witness one version of our planet's birth, in which humans are given the precious gift of freedom. When is our freedom to choose one thing instead of the other frightening? When does it feel especially juicy, and ripe with promise? How do we use our freedom wisely?

July 31 Radical Acceptance

Janine has been studying spiritual topics for the majority of her life. One thing has been truly transformativestudying the Buddhist wisdom of Acceptance vs Resistance. She is looking forward to sharing some of what she has learned and how it's helped her.

Side with Love

On June 24, 2022 the Supreme Court of the United States handed down its decision in the Dobbs v. Jackson case. The final opinion effectively overturned Roe v. Wade and eliminated federal protections for abortion. Each state will now be able to independently regulate abortion, with at least 26 states poised to entirely ban abortion care beginning immediately.

We weep for the millions of people and families that will be harmed-physically, spiritually, financially, and emotionally-because of this decision. We mourn that this ruling rolls back many decades of advances for reproductive health, rights, and justice. And we sit with the numbness, despair, and anger we feel knowing that white Christian nationalist misogyny has won the day.

Whenever our movements experience a major defeat, we take a beat to discern what our next moves will be. We all have the right to grieve, to rage, to mourn when we lose – it's what keeps us human, and reminds us why we keep fighting. (Sometimes this can look like mass protest, when we gather in the streets as a community together. Many communities are planning decision day #BansOffOurBodies marches or protests; find yours here.)
