TXUUJM February Newsletter: Warm up for Legislative Action Day! In the Texas UU Justice Ministry's February newsletter, sign up for trainings, for TXUUJM's Legislative Action Day on March 13th, and get the latest tips on how you can be taking action now that the 88th Texas Legislature is in session.

THE BIG DAY IS ALMOST HERE: <u>March 13th Legislative Action Day</u> is just two and a half weeks away!

WHO & WHAT? We need to know <u>WHO is coming</u> (and how many) so we can arrange the WHAT of legislative visits (plus food, shirts, and more).

WHY? Issues on the table, like postpartum healthcare, are life and death for Texans.

Likewise, it is crucial we show up in solidarity with trans and nonbinary-inclusive families, in support of inclusive public education, and more.

On March 13, we will:

- **Rally** with interfaith partners on the South Steps of the capitol, around the issue of Black maternal mortality and 12 months of postpartum healthcare for mothers and birthing people!
- Meet with legislators, staff, and committee folks to advocate for the bills and issues that matter
 to us! (TXUUJM and our partners will provide bill information, talking points, and schedule
 visits. We need you to sign up so we know you're coming!)
- **Sing**! UU hymns and justice songs will fill the main capitol rotunda, led by UU musicians and music directors, at 12 noon on a busy day in the capitol!
- Learn about the 88th Legislature and how to develop relationships and keep the pressure on our leaders to be accountable to the people!
