Today we celebrate the 100th anniversary of the first Flower Ceremony (AKA Flower Communion)! It was held in Prague in June 1923 and led by Rev. Norbert Čapek. We invite you to bring a flower to share during this annual tradition that celebrates beauty, human uniqueness, diversity, and community.

Minister's Musings

Did you know that May is Mental Health Awareness Month in the US? It has been observed here since 1949, in fact. As we continue to emerge from the pandemic and its many ripple effects, mental health is at the top of the list of concerns.

As Tim can attest, I'm a voracious podcast listener and I was struck by an assertion made by one of my favorite hosts:

"We all have mental health."

Mind blown!

For years, I've fallen into the trap of equating mental health with mental illness which is patently wrong. The phrase "mental health" can refer to any number of things, including good mental health. I now think of it as a spectrum where we can fall anywhere from extremely poor to excellent. And as with physical health, it's something we must constantly take care of on numerous fronts: daily habits and choices, education, professional help, to name a few.

While reading about how various national organizations are recognizing Mental Health Awareness Month this year, I found the National Alliance on Mental Illness' #morethanenough campaign.

It's an opportunity for all of us to come together and remember the inherent value we each hold — no matter our diagnosis, appearance, socioeconomic status, background or ability. We want every person out there to know that if all you did was wake up today, that's *more than enough*. No matter what, you are inherently worthy of *more than enough* life, love and healing. Showing up, just as you are, for yourself and the people around you is *more than enough*.

Throughout my life, I've dealt with bouts of self doubt that veered into deep anxiety that I've self diagnosed as imposter syndrome, so this reminder that I'm #morethanenough seems like an excellent tool to have on hand, especially during those times. It also dovetails nicely with a phrase I heard during some YMCA training during my years as a manager which was "Don't get paralyzed by perfection."

All of this is to say that while we do our best to embody UU values including recognizing the inherent worth and dignity of all, we must remember that we ourselves are included in that group!

As we head into the month of May and beyond I hope you'll take time to recognize that in yourself. You are worthy. Worthy of love. Worthy of good things in life, including good mental health. You are #morethanenough.
