October Minister's Musings by Rev. Julie Lombard



It seems like yesterday when I remember attending a Mass Bay UU Minister's retreat on Cape Cod, the couple of days there were filled with many spiritual experienced that soothed my soul, but the one that have stayed with me the longest was walking a labyrinth and taking time to collect shells on the nearby beach. It's not surprising that the things that stuck with me could be considered spiritual practices.

I started walking the labyrinth path with a racing mind. With each step I took my brain slowly let go of all it was holding. By the time I reached the center, I was astonished at all the many changes I had been through on that journey. My perspective changed with each twist and turn. I exited the

path with a new sense of self- I was changed by connecting with deeper sense of presence. The same was true with collecting sea shells on the beach. With each shell I gathered, I thought of a parishioner, and as my pockets filled up, I knew I also filled my heart with the love for my church family.

In the month of October, during worship we will explore forms of spiritual practice. Take this time to be inspired by the practices we consider and/or feel free to share your own practice. Spiritual practices ground us as we face many changes. What is your Spiritual Practice? Do you have one or more than one? Is it knitting or quilting, is hiking or walking, is it gardening or cooking? Has your practice(s) been impacted by the pandemic?

The seasonal changes found in autumn remind us of the many starts and stops that happen to us throughout the year. These changes can make it hard to settle into a routine, yet somehow we find a way like I did through the twists and turns of the labyrinth. These spiritual practices can help us stay grounded in the mist of change.

I urge you to celebrate each fall day by honoring the grace that is ever-present in your lives through your spiritual practices. Any ordinary act done mindfully can be turned into a spiritual practice- read a poem a day, listen to good music, plant bulbs, wash dishes, take your dog for a walk- explore your soul through these practices and let me know what you discover.

Sermon Blurbs: October 2020 – Worship Theme: Beginnings





Mid-Week Event: Online Drop-In Space:




Wednesdays 2 –2:30 PM

2020-21 Drop-ins: Small Group Ministry

Small Group Ministry is a vital part of many Unitarian Universalist (UU) congregations across America. In other churches they are called Chalice Circle or Covenant Groups. Groups of 8-10 people meet regularly, usually monthly, to reflect on and discuss significant life topics.

Small groups are great places to get to know other people and to get to know your better, too. Over time, participants build deep connections with one another, with the congregation and with the sacred.

Discussion topics are provided. The ones we'll use for Drop-ins will reflect our UU Principles and Purposes. The conversations we'll have will be respectful and caring and they'll lead to greater understanding of our UU values. In each session, facilitated by our minister, all participants have opportunity to share their perspectives, tell their stories, and listen deeply. The time together is structured: groups begin with a chalice lighting, centering readings, and some questions before the sharing begins.

Are Drop-ins for you? If you are not already in another Small Group Ministry at UUCOM, yes, please come. Maybe you just signed the membership book or did that long ago, or not at all-come and try it on and see how small group ministry fits for you. Board President Updates

Our UUCOM Board of Directors has been hard at work behind the scenes with several projects to lead our church in these challenging times. One of our very first, and on-going tasks, has been to form a Covid Care task force of members who are researching and reporting back to, the Board, their findings, data, and best practices involving church practices during Covid. The Board reviews the data from our local health department reporting on Covid infection rates to have current information on how the community is doing. The Covid Care team information guides the Board in making their decisions on church building use, practices, and guidelines. There will be a monthly update in the newsletter to let you know where we stand. We currently have a rubric to determine at what point we will allow use of the building. We are currently still in phase 1 as our community infection rates are too high to allow us to permit full use of the building. Currently only essential personnel are permitted in the building and with strict safety and reporting practices. Another project that the church is passionately working on is obtaining **Welcoming Church** certification. As we affirm the dignity and worth of all people and put our values into practice, we are working to become officially recognized by the Unitarian Universalist Association for our LGBTQ affirming practices as a congregation. Finally, we are addressing our Church Bylaws to revise them to be more inclusive, thorough, and applicable to our current times. That process has not been undertaken since 2014. We hope you will join us at the upcoming congregational meeting in November where we will all have a chance to vote on the changes and discuss the updates to our bylaws.

Our Board is an amazing group of people who has spent countless hours working on these and other tasks to keep our church thriving during these times. We hope that you have had a chance to meet, socialize and hear worship services from Rev. Julie. It is a joy to work with a kind hearted minister who is a true team player. We are
