Texas Permian Future Generations (TPFG) is a grassroots organization aiming to promote the health and economic sustainability of the West Texas Permian Basin region.



TPFG was created in 2020 by a group of Permian Basin residents concerned about the effect the oil field was having on the environment around them. Our goal is a Permian Basin with better workplace protections for people who work in the oilfield, better air and water quality, and fewer earthquakes, as well as a more diversified economy with more economic opportunities outside of the oil field.


TPFG is dedicated to providing educational materials to community members regarding the health and environmental impacts of the fossil fuel industry.

## **Banned Book Club**


