Minister's Musings

If you attended the service on August 20, you know that we had a spirited conversation about the taboo surrounding the word "evangelize." This was a continuation of the series of Sundays where we have a discussion versus a sermon.

These conversations have so much value. In real time, we are living out our third and fourth principles (the acceptance of one another and encouragement to spiritual growth in our congregations and a free and responsible search for truth and meaning, respectively). The discussions around taboos are particularly important to living out these principles. So



many of us come to Unitarian Universalism with the "baggage" of a multitude of direct and indirect bad experiences with organized religion. I have always found a tremendous source of power in "taking back" words.


One of the points I was happy to highlight was what we stand to gain as UUs if we embrace this particular taboo. Namely, growth for our beloved community which could ultimately result in a stronger, more vibrant congregation which could help to strengthen our wider community and even the world – which as it just so happens is a means of living up to our sixth principle, the goal of world community with peace, liberty, and justice for all.

I hope that our conversation has inspired you to embrace your inner "UU evangelist" - there's so many ways to spread our message of hope, like inviting a friend to Sunday worship or posting about us on social media. The world needs it now, more than ever!

Safe Place of the Permian Basin provides:

- 24-hour emergency shelter to families affected by domestic violence
- a 24-hour crisis hotline that can answer your questions about family and intimate partner violence and how to get help (1-800-967-8928)
- · personal and legal advocacy
- individual counseling
- support groups
- an intervention program for abusers


